

A special thanks goes out to Debbie Rodrigues for all her hard work to get these 'medibags' produced.



## with Medication-Assisted Recovery

The National Council recently partnered with the National Alliance for Recovery Residences and the Center for Social Innovation to release [Helping Recovery Residences Adapt to Support People with Medication-Assisted Recovery](#). This guide helps recovery residences that do not have experience with Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) integrate it into their recovery models. A crucial aspect of recovery from addiction is stable housing, but recovery residences may find it difficult to support residents on MAT when they have no prior experience.
