As we begin a new year and consider new initiatives within the Rx Safe Humboldt Coalition, let's take a moment and look back at some of the progress that was made in 2018.

Opioid Prescribing Rate Continues to Decline

According to the <u>CDPH Opioid Overdose</u>
<u>Surveillance Dashboard</u>, Humboldt County
continues to see a decline in the overall Opioid





Humboldt County remains 2nd in the state for the highest prescription opioid related overdose deaths. In 2017 the rate was <u>15.49 per 100,000 residents</u>, compared to the California average rate of 3.70 per 100,000 residents. There is good news, as the rates in 2018 are showing a decline. The most recent data from the second quarter of 2018, indicate that the prescription opioid related overdose death in Humboldt County were **12.14 per 100,000 residents**.

Medication Disposal

With <u>12 medication disposal bins</u> across Humboldt County, the convenience of proper medication disposal is evident. In 2018 these **12 bins** collected **2,521 pounds** of unwanted medications. Additional information regarding medication disposal can be <u>found here</u>.



Methamphetamine related issues in our community. Several compelling ideas were presented and discussed regarding the areas that the coalition could tackle and those that may apply to both Opioids and Methamphetamine. These ideas included

- Maintenance after sobriety
- Contingency Management
- Prevention
- Understanding the data
- Stopping the supply

The Coalition will continue to explore this during our next meeting and hope to develop strategies that would stay true to the mission of the Coalition.

Resources for Legislative Changes

There is a free 8-hour web-based course for physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants who wish to apply for a waiver to prescribe buprenorphine for the treatment of opioid use disorders.

This is a free training that will fulfill the requirements to obtain an x-waiver, but now under new legislation, <u>AB2487</u>, physicians and surgeons are required by law to complete either (a) a four-hour CME course on pain management or end of life, or (b) 12 hours on the treatment of opiate-dependent patients within four years of their initial license, or by their second renewal date.
